SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The South Yorkshire County Council (Northumberland Road, Sheffield) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 11th November 1980 the South Yorkshire County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 2nd December 1980 will be to prohibit waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in the side of road referred to in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the road and the services therein, the supply of gas, water and electricity, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets. The usual exceptions for disabled persons' vehicles are also included in the Order.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the restricted road may be examined during normal office hours at the offices of (i) the County Council, County Hall, Barnsley and (ii) County Engineer, Cambridge House, Division Street, Sheffield.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council (Bunbury Lane, Bunbury No. 16) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 14th November 1980, the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the existing public right of way which crosses the unused field at the rear of the Trinity Methodist Church, Bunbury Lane, Bunbury in a direct line from the northern corner of the field, behind the Church to the point where it crosses the south-western boundary 17 yards from the southern corner of the field to henceforth enter the northern corner of the field and continue in a south-easterly direction for approximately 23 yards and then cross the field following a series of directional changes, leaving the field at the existing point of entry.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Secretary and Solicitor's office and may be inspected free of charge during the usual office hours.

This Order will become operative on the date that an alternative footpath to replace the existing footpath is created to the satisfaction of the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council. If any person is aggrieved by the Order and wishes to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he/she may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from November 1980, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
