### THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Kent County Council (Tyland, Boxley and Cossington, Aylesford) (One-way and Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980.*

Notice is hereby given that on 20th November 1980, the Kent County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended the effect of which is to:

- (a) revoke the County Council of Kent (Tyland, Boxley and Cossington, Aylesford) (One-way and Prohibition of Turning Movements) Order 1972, and to re-enact that part which prohibits the driving of vehicles otherwise than south-eastwards in Old Chatham Road from Pilgrims Way for 160 yards south-eastwards; and
- (b) prohibit vehicles from entering the gaps in the central reservation on A229 Chatham Road, situated 120 yards and 360 yards north of the north side of the M20 Bridge.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

*Lancashire County Council (Restricted Roads) (No. ) Order 198 and (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. ) Order 198*

#### *Imposition of 30 m.p.h. and 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit*

Notice is hereby given that the Lancashire County Council propose to make Orders under sections 72 (3) and 73 (1) and section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be:

The 30 m.p.h. speed limit imposed on Banks Road east of the Merseyside County Boundary, Ralph's Wives Lane, Church Road, Chapel Lane, New Lane Pace, Marsh Road, Hoole Lane, Guinea Hall Lane and Station Road by virtue of section 72 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 shall cease to have effect.

To restrict the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule to this notice to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h. and;

To restrict the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this notice to a speed limit of 40 m.p.h.

#### *Length of Road at Banks, in the District of West Lancashire*

(a) That length of Ralph's Wives Lane between a point 930 metres (1,017 yards) east of the Merseyside County Boundary and Church Road;

(b) Church Road; Chapel Lane; New Lane Pace; Marsh Road between New Lane Pace and a point 35 metres (38 yards) east of New Lane Pace.

(c) That length of Hoole Lane and Guinea Hall Lane, between Church Road and the junction with Southport New Road, A565 at the roundabout.

(d) That length of Station Road between Guinea Hall Lane/Hoole Lane and a point 37 metres (40 yards) east of Water Lane, A565.

### LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*Lincolnshire County Council (Lincoln Road (B1190) Washingborough (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1980*

### GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Greater Manchester County (Albert Square|Lloyd Street|Mount Street, Manchester) (Prescribed Routes) (County) Order 1980.*
