### WELSH OFFICE

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the length of highway described in the Schedule below to enable development to be carried out. Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Transport and High-ways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting Ref. WR15/7/136), and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Cardiff City Council, City Hall, Cardiff. Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of

the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 18th December 1980, apply to the High Court for the suspen-sion or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

#### SCHEDULE

### (all distances are approximate)

The lengths of highway to be stopped up are at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan:

(a) that length of highway on the eastern side of Central Square which has a maximum width of 1 yard and which extends from a point 33 yards south of Wood
