#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Devon (Various Streets, Totnes) (Restriction of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that on 31st December 1980 the Devon County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2), (3) and (3AA) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the Order comes into effect on 5th January 1981, no heavy commercial vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds 3 tons will be permitted to proceed in the following lengths of road at Totnes in the District of South Hams:

*Castle Street*, between its junction with Alpha Terrace and its junction with High Street;  
*Antrim Terrace*, full length;  
*Belmont Terrace*, full length;  
*Priory Hill*, full length;  
*Alexandra Terrace*, full length;  
*North Street*, full length;  
*North Street*, full length;  
*Church Close*, full length;  
*Guildhall Yard*, full length.

Exemptions in the Order permit heavy commercial vehicles to proceed in these roads for the purpose of conveyance of persons, goods or burden to or from any premises in or adjacent to these lengths of road, for the purposes of agriculture, building, industrial or demolition operations, removal of obstructions to traffic, maintenance of the roads, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes and for the garaging, servicing and repair of vehicles.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the affected lengths of road may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes, or at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or any provision made under it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the relevant section of the Act or that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with, you may, within 6 weeks of the date of this Order, apply to the High Court for that purpose.

#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Devon (Various Streets, Buckfastleigh) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1981*

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended, consolidating and extending existing restrictions in Buckfastleigh.

When the proposed Order comes into effect, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time in the following lengths of road:

*Chapel Street*, north side, from its junction with Market Street for a distance of 25 metres in an easterly direction.

*Market Street*, east side, from its junction with Chapel Street for a distance of 25 metres in a northerly direction.

*New Road*, both sides, from its junction with Chapel Street for a distance of 15 metres.

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading or unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are included.

#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Devon (Fore Street Residential Zone, Kingsteignton) (Control of Commercial Vehicles) Order 1980.*

Notice is hereby given that on 24th December 1980, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2), (3), (3AA) and (6) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the Order comes into operation on 3rd January 1981:

No person shall cause any heavy commercial vehicle to proceed on any road or length of road in the Fore Street Residential Zone at Kingsteignton in the County of Devon, as described in Schedule 1 to this notice.

Exemptions in the Order permit heavy commercial vehicles to proceed in these roads for the purpose of conveyance of goods to or from any premises within the Fore Street Residential Zone, for the purposes of agriculture, building, industrial or demolition operations, removal of obstructions to traffic, maintenance of the roads, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes, for garaging, servicing or repair of vehicles or to cross the Fore Street Residential Zone, provided the vehicle is being driven in the direction specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice in the lengths of road specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.

#### SCHEDULE 1

##### Description of Controlled Zone

"Fore Street Residential Zone" means all that area in the Parish of Kingsteignton in the County of Devon which is:

- bounded by but does not include the road or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 Part A to this notice;
- bounded by and includes the roads or lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 Part B to this notice;
- bounded on the southern side by the River Teign between the point of its crossing beneath the A380 Kingsteignton By-pass and the point of its crossing beneath the B3195 Newton Road.
