CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

Richard and Micheline Pranzo whose last known address is 5 Rue de L'Inondation, 76400 Fecamp, France.

19th January 1981 Pursuant to section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods,

A Motor Ketch named Funchito Negro registered in the port of Fecamp, France imported into the United Kingdom on 16th September 1979, has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that:

(1) The said Ketch Funchito Negro was imported into the United Kingdom by Richard Pranzo and Micheline Pranzo without payment of customs duty or Value Added Tax under the provisions of the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Order 1970. (Personal Reliefs) Order 1970.

Article 6 of the aforesaid Order sets out conditions that shall be complied with after importation in respect of

goods of which payment of duty has not been required. In breach of Article 6 (II) of the aforesaid Order the said Richard Pranzo and or Micheline Pranzo failed to export the said Motor Ketch Funchito Negro from the United Kingdom within 12 months of the date of importation on 16th September 1979.

Whereby and by force of section 124(1)(b) Customs & Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
