THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Blackmill to Tony-refail Route A4093 Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980, the above Order which was made by the Mid Glamorgan County Council under sections 1 and 62 of the Highways Act 1971, and which, as confirmed, provides for authorising the Council:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways.

(b) to stop up highways.

all on or in the vicinity of the Blackmill to Tonyrefail Principal Road A4093 which is to be improved between its junction with an unclassified road at Dan-y-Coed, and the access to Isfryn Industrial Estate at Blackmill in the County of Mid Glamorgan.

Copies of the Order (as confirmed) and the relevant plan may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of Mid Glamorgan County Council, County Hall, Cardiff, and at the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Therebean Cordiff Llanishen, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 (which incorporates the provisions of the Highways Act 1971), or on the grounds that any requirement of the Highways Act 1980 (including the provisions of the Highways Act 1971), or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in lations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 19th February 1981, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
