TREASURY

CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSIT (SERIES 5)

On and after Monday, 2nd March 1981 the rates of interest applicable to deposits accepted under the Prospectus (series 5) dated 31st July 1980 and applied in payment of a scheduled liability will be 12½ per cent. The rate of interest on deposits withdrawn for cash will be 10 per cent. An interest supplement, which is only payable in respect of a deposit applied in payment of a scheduled liability, of 1½ per cent. will be paid in respect of the first month of a deposit. A nil rate of bonus will apply to deposits held for more than six months and applied in payment of a scheduled liability. These rates remain in force until further notice.

On and after Monday, 2nd March 1981 these rates also apply until further notice to deposits made under the earlier Prospectuses (Series 1, 2, 3 and 4) which reach the second or fourth anniversary of the deposits, as applicable, in accordance with the terms and conditions set out therein.
