The Trunk Road (Glan Conwy, Gwynedd) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended. The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle for more than 30 minutes in any period of 90 minutes between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., on the side of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the proposed Order will permit waiting for

the following purposes:

- (a) picking up or setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building, industrial or demolition operations; and
- (d) carrying out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, water and electricity.

The usual exceptions have also been provided in the proposed Order for vehicles displaying a disabled person's

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the South Derbyshire District Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the above Act to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on lengths of West Street and Market Street, Swadlincote.

(b) On behalf of a statutory undertaker or the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 under, in, on, over, along or across the highway or any land adjacent to the highway;

(c) On behalf of a water authority and engaged upon the laying, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any public sewer under, in, on, over, along or across the highway or any land adjacent to the highway;

(d) On an area of West Street where the vehicle is a goods vehicle (as defined by Schedule 4 of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971) and is being used for the delivery or collection of goods to or from premises known as Nos. 1 to 15 West Street (odd), but only in a westerly direction.

The proposed Order will require the provision of a new highway.
