

that Country, and the States of Holland re to take that Affair into their Consideration before they separate. The Admiralties of Amsterdam and the Meuse are sitting out with great diligence all the Ships that are lately com'd into Port; and it is said that they will Sail very speedily, in order to join the British Fleet Commanded by Sir John Leake. The States of Holland will come to a Resolution this Day, or to Morrow, in relation to the Project of raising six Millions of Florins by way of Lottery, which is in a great measure settled already, and will, as it is thought, be Published this Week by order of the States. The King of Prussia is still at Honfleur, where his Majesty proposeth to continue for two or three Days longer, by which time some Alterations that are making by his Majesty's Order in his Apartment in the Old Court, will be finish'd. The Prince of Nassau having signified to the States his desire of conferring with his Father-in-Law, the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, before he came hither upon their Invitation, the States have likewise sent an Invitation to that Prince, and hope his Presence and Assistance will be a means to promote the Accommodation between his Prussian Majesty and the Prince of Nassau, and the Express sent for that purpose to Hesse-Cassel is expected back on Friday or Saturday. In the mean time the States have written again to the Prince, to press him to come hither. Our Letters from the Frontiers advise, that the French have made a Detachment from their Army for Germany, and that the late Elector of Bavaria is to have the Command of the Forces in those Parts; whereupon the Imperial and Palatin Troops have been likewise detach'd from our Army, and are accordingly marching towards the Rhine thro' Aeth, Nivelle and Maestricht. Those Forces will soon be followed by the Prince of Savoy, who is expected here to Morrow, or the Day following, a Yacht having been ordered to Antwerp to receive him on Board, and conduct him hither. Monsieur de St. Saphorini, heretofore Envoy to this State from the Canton of Berne, is come hither in his way to London, for which Place he proposeth to embark with the first Opportunity.
