*The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Kirklees) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council made the above-named Order on 22nd April 1981, under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

- (a) to prohibit waiting by vehicles at all times in lengths of Stocksbank Road, Nab Lane, The Knowl and Nettleton Road, Mirfield.
- (b) to prohibit waiting by vehicles from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in a length of the northern side of Nab Lane, Mirfield, near its junction with Stocksbank Road.

#### WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

*The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Kirklees) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 14) Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.
