If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 5th May 1981 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

May 1981 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Chesterfield Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.
