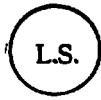

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968  
(AS AMENDED)

*Uruguay: Official Certificate*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly, give notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 97), as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973 and 1979 (S.I. 1973 No. 1351 and S.I. 1979 No. 1426) and the Transfer of Functions (Wales) (No. 1) Order 1978 (S.I. 1978 No. 272) they hereby recognise, subject to the condition hereafter set out, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in Part I of the Schedule hereto as showing:

(a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministers, and

(b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

1. Recognition of the Official Certificate is extended to include:

Carcases or portions of carcasses comprising recognisable wholesale or retail cuts, without bone, which contain no associated lymphatic glands or from which any

pleura, peritoneum or lymphatic gland has been removed.

2. The said Certification is recognised subject to the following conditions:

(a) this recognition applies to meat and meat products imported from Uruguay but does not apply to any such meat or meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.

(b) Where the Official Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificate.

(c) Where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product.

(d) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in Part II of the Schedule hereto. The notice published in the *London Gazette*, dated 1st April 1980, and the notice published in the *London Gazette*, dated 10th June 1980 are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Part 1

For meat:

The health mark must be an oval mark 6.5 cm. wide by 4.5 cm. high. The following information must appear in perfectly legible characters:

On the upper part, URUGUAY in capitals, or, if appropriate, the set of initials approved under the International Convention on Motor Vehicle Registration, viz: U.

In the centre, the veterinary approval number of the slaughterhouse or cutting plant.

The letters must be 0.8 cm. high and the figures 1 cm. high. The mark may include an indication of the Official Veterinarian who carried out the health inspection.

For meat products:

A label or stamp in the form below:



The certificate will be completed by the insertion of the establishment number.
