inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);

(e) to specify that in respect of a residents' parking place the charge would be at a rate of 12½p per day;

Note. If a season ticket is displayed on a vehicle left in a residents' parking place the daily charge is not payable.

Season tickets cost $\pounds 2.75$, $\pounds 7.50$ and $\pounds 26$ for tickets expiring at the end of 1 month, 3 months and 12 months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued.

(An application was made on 3rd April 1981 by the Council of the London Borough of Islington to the Greater London Council for an Order to be made which, if approved, would dispense with the daily charge and increase the cost of season tickets to £6.50, £17.50 and £60 respectively.)

(f) to specify that the vehicles which may be left in a residents parking place shall be those displaying a valid residents permit issued under the provisions of the Islington (Parking Places) Order 1976 by this Council.

The charges, classes of vehicles and all other time limits in connection with the use of the metered parking places would remain unchanged.

2. The effect of the Order would be:

(a) To revoke the designation by the Order listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice of the parking place allocated the number specified in column 2 of that Schedule and which is situated on the highway specified in column 3 of that Schedule;

(b) To designate parking places on the highways specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Notice at which charges may be made by the Royal Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;

(c) To provide that the type of parking place, the maximum initial period, the rate of charge, the excess period and excess charge (payable to the Royal Borough Council), and the hours of operation of that parking place will be as set out in columns 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 respectively of the said Schedule 2;

Note If a season ticket is displayed on a vehicle left in a residents' parking place, the daily charge is not payable. Season tickets cost $\pounds 2.50$ or $\pounds 8.75$ for solo motor-cycles and $\pounds 11$ or $\pounds 38.50$ for all other vehicles for tickets expiring at the end of three months and 12 months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they first became valid. (These charges are under review).

(d) To provide that the vehicles which may be left:

- (i) in a residents' parking place shall be vehicles displaying a valid permit issued by the Roayl Borough Council;
 (e) To provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

The restrictions imposed by the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) Order, 1976, would apply to any areas previously designated as parking places but not re-designated as such as they apply in the immediate vicinity.
