

The Orders become operative as from 14th May 1981, but if a person aggrieved by the Orders desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 8th May 1981, make an application for the purpose in the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119

The Oxfordshire County Council (Letcombe Regis Footpath 6A) Public Path Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 6th May 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Oxfordshire County Council as an unopposed Order. The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to extinguish the public right of way over land situate in the Parish of Letcombe Regis in the County of Oxfordshire known as footpath 6A which extends from Letcombe Regis Bridleway 6 at a well north of Hell Bottom in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 85 metres and in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 145 metres to meet Letcombe Bassett Footpath No. 8 at the Letcombe Bassett Parish Boundary and to create from the date of confirmation of the Order a public footpath from Letcombe Regis Bridleway 6 at a well north of Hell Bottom in a west-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 122 metres to meet Letcombe Bassett Footpath No. 8 at the Letcombe Bassett Parish Boundary.

Copies of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the County Solicitor, County Hall, New Road, Oxford, and at the offices of the Vale of White Horse District Council, Portway, Wantage, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday, to Friday.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, Oxfordshire County Council, County Hall, New Road, Oxford, quoting Ref. SG/ACV62/41/6A before the 8th June 1981 and should state the grounds upon which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the Oxfordshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

If you wish to be notified if the Order is confirmed and to have a copy of the Order as confirmed you should write to the County Solicitor of the Oxfordshire County Council at the above-mentioned address and quoting the above-mentioned reference, giving your name and address to which the documents may be sent.

REIGATE AND BANSTEAD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Reigate and Banstead (Public Footpath No. 18, Banstead (Part), Public Path Diversion Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 5th May 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Borough of Reigate and Banstead. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish part of the public footpath No. 18 from the cul-de-sac end of Kingscroft Road, Banstead in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 410 metres to a point approximately 140 metres south of the junction of Chalmers Road and Cunningham Road, Banstead and to create a public right of way from the cul-de-sac end of Kingscroft Road to the rear boundary of "Lilliput", Cunningham Road, Banstead in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 150 metres, thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 230 metres to a point approximately 150 metres south of the junction of Chalmers Road and Cunningham Road, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres to rejoin the existing Footpath No. 18.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn, the Borough Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
