(b) the Hounslow (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 1, 1974 and No. 1, 1978) (Amendment No. 2) Traffic Order 1981 under sections 6 and 84D of the above-mentioned Act of 1967, as so amended.

- 2. The effect of the Prescribed Route Order will be to prohibit the right turn by vehicular traffic from Harlington Road West into Staines Road, Bedfont.
