The York-Hull Trunk Road (A1079) (Beverley South-Western By-Pass) (24-hour Main Carriageway Clearway) Order 1981

The Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport

Act 1968, the effect of which will be: 1. To prohibit waiting in any of the main carriageways of the York-Hull Trunk Road (A1079) known as the Beverley South-Western By-Pass situated in the District of Beverley in the county of Humberside which extends from its junction with Killingwoldgraves Lane (C60) in a south-easterly direc-tion to a point 400 metres south of the Dene Close/Beverley Road junction at Dunswell, a distance measured along the trunk road of approximately 9.2 kilometres; and 2. To prohibit waiting by any vehicle for the purpose of trading, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken

adjacent to the carriageway or in any lay-by separated from a main carriageway by a verge.

- The prohibition imposed by the Order will not apply:
- (a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden;
- (b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;
- (c) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes
- (d) to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
- to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or col-(e) lecting postal packets;
- (f) to a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway referred to in that Article while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on that carriageway; or

(g) to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of it:
(i) is required by law to stop;
(ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside

- his control.

A copy of the draft Order which together with a plan showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during office hours at the offices of Humberside County Council Offices, Eastgate, Beverley, the North Eastern Road Construction Unit, Windsor House, Cornwall Road, Harrogate or obtained by application to the Regional Controller, Roads and Transportation, Department of Transport, 9th Floor, City House, Leeds LS1 4JD.

Any person desiring to object to the Secretary of State's proposal to make the Order should send not later than 3rd June 1981 and to the Regional Controller's address listed above, quoting reference DYH5060/41/2/TR70/1, a written statement of his or her objection and the grounds thereof.
