BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Bedfordshire (Various Roads Langford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Bed-fordshire propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the following lengths of road in Langford:
