HALTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Halton Borough Council (Alfred Street (Part), Widnes) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Halton Borough Council by an Order made on 13th May 1981 under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, has directed that the above-named Experimental Traffic Regulation Order shall continue in force until 17th November 1981.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Santridge Lane, Bromsgrove) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Hereford and Worcester propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other powers the effect of which will be to restrict the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive on the following lengths of Santridge Lane in the District of Bromsgrove in the County of Hereford and Worcester:

(i) North-east side, from its junction with B4091 Stourbridge Road for a distance of 57 metres (187 feet) in a westerly and northerly direction.

(ii) South side, from its junction with B4091 Stourbridge Road for a distance of 20 metres (66 feet) in a westerly direction.

Waiting by vehicles of the under-mentioned classes or for the under-mentioned purposes are exempted from the provisions of the Order:

(a) to enable persons to board or alight,

(b) to enable goods to be loaded and unloaded,

(c) vehicles in use by the Post Office,

(d) to enable certain essential works to be carried out or in pursuance of statutory powers or duties,

(e) for the collection or delivery of furniture or effects with police consent,

(f) for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes,

(g) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, and the supply of gas, electricity and water and maintenance of telegraphic lines.

An exemption in this Order also permits disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge and parking disc issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme to wait on sides of lengths of roads affected for a limited period of 2 hours (return prohibited within a further period of 1 hour).

A copy of the draft Order and map showing the sides of lengths of roads affected and a copy of the County Council's Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected at the offices of Bromsgrove District Council, Birmingham Road, Bromsgrove, Worcs, and at County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester, from Monday to Friday during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, giving reasons, must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 12th June 1981.
