The Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by the Ashfield District Council that an alternative right of way has been provided, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, with 6 weeks from 15th May 1981 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Broadland District Council (Brundall Footpath No. 1 and Brundall Footpath No. 12) Public Path Diversion Orders 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders") made on 12th May 1981 are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Broadland District Council as unopposed Orders.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modifications, will be:

- (i) to divert that part of the public footpath No. 1 running from a point 130 metres east of its junction with Cucumber Lane, Brundall, Norfolk, in an approximately south-easterly direction for a distance of 60 metres, and thence in an easterly direction for a distance of 50 metres; to a line running along a new highway which shall be a footpath provided in the course of development of the land over which the footpath runs and shown coloured blue on the map annexed to the Diversion Order; and
- (ii) to divert all that part of the public footpath No. 12 running in a south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 50 metres from a point on footpath No. 1 being 130 metres east of its junction with Cucumber Lane, Brundall; to a line running along a new highway which shall be a footpath provided in the course of development of the land over which the footpath runs and shown coloured orange on the map annexed to the Diversion Order.

Broadland District Council (Cantley, Footpath No. 10) Public Path Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 12th May 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Broadland District Council as an unopposed Order.

DUDLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH

LOCAL GOVERNMENT, PLANNING AND LAND ACT 1980

Parkhead Locks, Dudley

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of their powers under section 277 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended by paragraph 26 of Schedule 15 to the Local Government, Planning and Land Act 1980, the Borough Council of Dudley have determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said area as a conservation area.

The effect of the designation of this area is briefly that:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended.
- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or part of a building situate within the Conservation area must first apply to the Council for written consent to demolition. (This requirement still applies even if the demolition is authorised by planning permission.)
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot a tree situate within the conservation area and not already protected by a tree preservation order must give 6 weeks prior notice of his intention to the local planning authority.

A plan of the conservation area may be inspected during normal office hours at the Department of Planning and Development, 5 Ednam Road, Dudley.
