Diversion Order 1981*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, hereinafter referred to as "the Order", made on 6th April 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Hampshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the length of footpath specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto and to create an alternative highway as specified in Part II of the Schedule.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the Borough Secretary, Havant Borough Council, Civic Offices, Civic Centre Road, Havant; at Waterlooville Post Office, Waterlooville and at the office of the undersigned and may be inspected free of charge during the usual office hours.

If you wish to be notified if the Order is confirmed and to have a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Hampshire County Council, The Castle, Winchester, giving your name and address to which the documents should be sent.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Hampshire County Council not later than 15th June 1981 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

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If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Hampshire County Council, may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

## SCHEDULE

## PART I

*Description of Site of Existing Path*

That part of the footpath in the Borough of Havant shown on the definitive map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 as Footpath No. 126 which commences at a junction with Inhurst Avenue and runs east-north-eastwards for approximately 32 metres then south-south-eastwards for approximately 24 metres then north-eastwards for approximately 258 metres. A total distance of approximately 314 metres.

## PART II

*Description of Site of Alternative Highway*

A 1.8 metre wide earth path which commences at the northern end of the path described in Part I of this Schedule and runs eastwards for approximately 26 metres then south-south-eastwards for approximately 142 metres then onto a 1.2 metre wide earth and grass path and running generally south-westwards for approximately 230 metres then arcing southwards for approximately 85 metres. A total distance of approximately 483 metres.

*The District Council of New Forest (Fordingbridge Footpath No. 88) Diversion Order 1981*

Notice is hereby given that on 11th May 1981 the District Council of New Forest confirmed the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"). The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way known as Footpath No. 88 from its junction with Footpath No. 80 known as Marl Lane to a point approximately 108 metres to the north-east thereof to a line running first in an easterly direction and then in a predominantly northerly direction to a point approximately 128 metres to the north-east of its junction with the said Footpath No. 80 being its junction with Footpath No. 88.

A copy of the confirmed Order and a map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the District Council of New Forest, Appletree Court, Lyndhurst, Hampshire and Public Offices, Ringwood, Hampshire and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 18th May 1981. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 15th May 1981 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
