SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The South Yorkshire County Council (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 9) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that on 12th May 1981 the South Yorkshire County Council with the consent of the Minister of Transport made an Order under section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 27th May 1981 will be to impose a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The City of Bristol, King Georges Road, Bishopsworth, Public Path Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 13th May 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Council of the City of Bristol (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert approximately 150 yards of public footpath No. 490 from point A on the map in a northerly direction along Broadway Road and then in an easterly direction along King Georges Road for approximately 400 yards.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which had been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
