

footpath No. 3 which runs in a south-westerly, westerly and south-westerly direction to a point approximately eight metres west of the south-western boundary of the Ivybridge Pumping station and to substitute a new length between the same two points but running in a south-easterly direction, thence along the southern boundary of the pumping station to a point where it meets the existing path.

- (ii) a length of footpath No. 3 by closing that section of the path which runs from a point approximately 20 metres south-west of its junction with footpath No. 1 running in a south-westerly direction to the eastern side of Gipsy Lane and to substitute a new length of path between the same two points running in a generally south-westerly direction along the proposed estate paths and roads.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the North Wiltshire District Council, Monkton Park, Chippenham and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 21st May 1981, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 21st May 1981, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

COAL INDUSTRY ACT 1975

Coal and Mines of Coal under former copyhold land
