Notice of Intention to make a Smoke Control Order

Notice is hereby given that the Mansfield District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 as amended by Schedule 2 of the Local Government, Planning and Land Act 1980, propose to make an Order entitled "The Mansfield District Council (No. 7) Smoke Control Order 1981" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

It is proposed that the Order will not come into operation before 1st August 1982, or before such later date as the Council may subsequently determine.

A copy of the draft Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Director of Central Administration and Legal Services, Manor House, Mansfield Woodhouse, at all reasonable times from the date hereof until 8th July 1981.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Council's Director of Central Administration and Legal Services at the above address object to the making of the Order.

SOUTH TYNESIDE BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

The South Tyneside No. 6 Smoke Control (Variation) Order No. 2, 1981

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of South Tyneside in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11(5) of the Clean Air Act 1956, on 15th May 1981, made an Order entitled the South Tyneside No. 6 Smoke Control (Variation) Order No. 2, 1981, by providing that the buildings specified in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be exempt from the operation of section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, so that the emission of smoke from a chimney of these buildings will be an offence.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after this Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from the chimney of any of the buildings specified in the Schedule hereto the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the smoke was not caused by the use of fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Subject to the provisions of section 9, 1968, any person who acquires for use in a Smoke Control Area or who sells by retail delivery in a Smoke Control Area any solid fuel other than the authorised fuel shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before 1st November 1982, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Solicitor to the Council at the Town Hall, South Shields, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays during the period of 6 weeks from 28th May 1981.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Becket House, Lambeth Palace Road, London SE1 7ER object to the confirmation of the Order.
