- (2) The Skipton-Bradley-Farnhill Unclassified County Road from its junction with the north-west of Doncaster-Kendal Trunk Road A629 to its junction with Silsden Road, Low Bradley (Unclassified County Road).
- (3) Silsden Road and Jackson's Lane, Low Bradley (Unclassified County Road).
- (4) High Bradley Lane, Unclassified County Road.
- (5) College Road, Low Bradley, Unclassified County Road.

An exemption is included in the Order for Public Service Vehicles employed on stage carriage services and school buses.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 2nd June 1981 together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and NYCC Area Office, Croft House, Carleton Road, Skipton, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 22nd May 1981 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
