The Trunk Road (Stockton-Thornaby Diversion A66) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1981

The Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the Penrith—Middlesbrough Trunk Road (A66) at Stocktonon-Tees in the County of Cleveland.

- 2. The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 27th May 1981, is to prohibit vehicles entering or leaving the Stockton—Thornaby Diversion, A66, at its junction with the access roads to Whessoe's Bowesfield Works on both the north and south sides of the trunk road.
- 3. Exceptions have been provided in the Order for police purposes, or for any vehicle being moved under police escort which is authorised for the use on roads by the Motor Vehicles (Authorisation of Special Types) General Order 1979, or by any special Order made by the Minister of Transport under section 42 of the Road Transport under section 42 of the Road Traffic Act 1972.
- 4. Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 27th May 1981 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the Penrith-Middlesbrough and East of Snaith-Sunderland Trunk Roads (A66 and A19) in the Boroughs of Stockton-on-Tees and Middlesbrough in the County of Cleveland.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting on any of the main carriageways (including the carriageways of the slip roads) forming part of:

- (b) the trunk road (A19) between its junction with the southern slip roads at Parkway Interchange and its junction with the north-western slip roads at Haverton Hill Interchange.

- (a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden:
- (b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;
- (c) to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (d) to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
- (e) to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of it is:
 - (i) required by law to stop;
 - (ii) obliged to stop to avoid an accident; or
 - (iii) prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
