NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Huntingdon District Council Public Path (Extinguishment) (No. 1) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that on 21st May 1981 the Huntingdon District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to extinguish the footpath at St. Neots which extends in a general westerly direction for a distance of approximately 64 metres from its junction with Huntingdon Street at a point approximately 60 metres north of The Cross.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the District Council, Pathfinder House, St. Mary's Street, Huntingdon during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 21st May 1981 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 26th May 1981 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Huntingdon District Council (Footpath No. 1 at Kings Ripton) Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 21st May 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Huntingdon District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of Footpath No. 1 at Kings Ripton which extends in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 37 metres from its junction with Main Street in such a manner as it shall be

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replaced by a path on a strip of land 2 metres in width which extends in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 32 metres from a point on Main Street, Kings Ripton which lies approximately 18 metres north of the present junction with Footpath No. 1.

A copy of the order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council's offices, Pathfinder House, St. Mary's Street, Huntingdon between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Huntingdon District Council, Pathfinder House, Huntingdon not later than 1st July 1981 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Huntingdon District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the order.

LEICESTER CITY COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Leicester City Council Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 Article 4 Direction South Highfields Conservation Area.

Notice is hereby given that the Leicester City Council on 30th April 1981 resolved to make and submit to the Secretary of State for confirmation a Direction under Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 restricting the permitted development of residential properties not included in the listed buildings of special architectural or historic interest compiled by the Department of the Environment, in the South Highfields Conservation Area without permission being granted on an application in that behalf.

As from the date of the publication of this Order, planning permission will be required for any works which change the appearance of the outside of properties within the Housing Action Area. The Direction prescribes the works which will need the consent of the Planning Authority, as follows:

Class I(1)—The enlargement, improvement or any other alteration to a dwellinghouse.

Class I(2)—The erection or construction of a porch outside any external door of a dwellinghouse.

Class I(4)—The construction within the curtilage of a dwellinghouse of a hardstanding for vehicles for a purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwellinghouse as such.

Class II(3)—The painting of the exterior of any building or work otherwise than for the purpose of advertisement, announcement or direction.
