#### MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

*Mid Glamorgan County Council (Elm Grove, Gadlys, Aberdare) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1981*

Notice is hereby given that on 21st May 1981 the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the length of road and side of length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions are provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge, will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The Order came into operation on 29th May 1981 and a copy thereof and a map showing the length of road and side of length of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 29th May 1981.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act as so amended or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 29th May 1981 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

*Mid Glamorgan County Council (Route B4181, Coychurch to Bridgend Road) (Classified un-numbered Road between Coychurch and Coity) (Revocation and 40 m.p.h. Speed Restriction) Order 1981*
