WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Kirklees) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 27) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

- (a) To impose one-way working for vehicles on The Avenue, Moldgreen, Huddersfield (northbound) and on Poplar Terrace (eastbound and then southbound).
- (b) To prohibit waiting by vehicles from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in The Avenue (west side) and Poplar Terrace (north and east sides).

The Order comes into force on 18th June 1981 and a copy of the Order, which contains the usual exemptions, and of a map showing the lengths of road affected, may be examined during normal office hours at the Reception Desk at the main entrance to County Hall, Wakefield, and at the County Council's DoPET Office, Albion Street, Huddersfield.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date upon which the Order was made (i.e. 9th June 1981) apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Cleethorpes Borough Council (Cleethorpes—Footpath No. 2) Public Path Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 2nd June 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order by the Cleethorpes Borough Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way which commences on the west side of the road leading towards the Southern Outfall Pumping Station off the Kings Road extension and runs in a northerly direction through an area of open space, being part of O.S. Field 1311, for a distance of approximately 85 yards to a point where the footpath alters its course to a north westerly direction near the miniature railway crossing to a new line commencing on the west side of the miniature railway track near the junction of the road leading towards the Southern Outfall Pumping Station and the Kings Road extension and running in a generally northerly direction through an area of open space, being part of O.S. Field 1311, on the west side of the miniature railway track for a distance of approximately 95 yards to the same point where the footpath alters its course to a north westerly direction near the miniature railway crossing.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Planning Department, Council House, Cleethorpes, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.
