THE SCHEDULE

Part I. Description of Site of Existing Public Footpath

The length of Public Footpath No. 22 in Llangwm Community to be diverted commences on the County Unclassified Road Route No. C63-5 and proceeds in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 50 yards or thereabouts and as shown on the plan annexed to the Order in a solid purple line and marked a-b.

Part II. Description of Proposed Alternative Route

The proposed alternative route to replace the length of Public Footpath No. 22 in Llangwm Community to be diverted commences on the County Unclassified Road Route No. C63-5 and proceeds along the said Unclassified Road in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 30 yards or thereabouts and then proceeds along the Housing Estate Road known as "Millbrook" in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 35 yards or thereabouts all as shown on the plan annexed to the Order in a solid brown line and marked c-d.

Leeds City Council (Pudsey Footpath No. 30 Spring Valley, Stanningley, Pudsey) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 23rd October 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment and Transport for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Leeds City Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point at the northerly end of Spring Valley from its junction with Temperance Street running in a southerly direction for a distance of 83 metres approximately to its junction with Sun Field.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The North Yorkshire County Council, Village of Staxton in the Parish of Willerby, Scarborough Footpath Diversion Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 15th October 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the existing footpath that runs from the estate road development, crossing the road in a southerly direction, then turning easterly and following the footway for approximately 23 metres. The route then turns south following a narrow elevated section of path between the garden boundary of Plot 17 of the development and the boundary hedge of the lane leading to O.S. Filed 5728, finally turning east over a stile into the access lane to Field O.S. 5728 where it joins the existing path, a total distance of 57 metres. The new route commences on the estate road development, running east along the footway alongside the road to where it meets the boundary of the development, crossing a stile into the access lane to O.S. Field 5728, then turning in a southerly direction and following the access lane boundary to where it meets the existing footpath, a total distance of 56 metres.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at County Hall, Northallerton, and at N.Y.C.C. Divisional Office, Garth End Road, West Ayton, Scarborough, during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, North Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, before 25th November 1981, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Yorkshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
