DURHAM COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Durham (Seaham Prohibition of Entry and 3 ton Unladen Weight Restriction) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council have made an Order under sections 9 and 3AA of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, and by section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 16th November 1981 will be to prohibit and restrict traffic on roads at Seaham in the Easington District as follows:

(1) No person shall cause any heavy commercial vehicle of unladen weight which exceeds 3 tons proceeding in any of the roads referred to in column 1 of Schedule 1 to enter the roads in column 2 of Schedule 1.

(Stage carriages, scheduled express carriages, school buses and works buses are exempted.)

(2) No person shall cause any heavy commercial vehicle of unladen weight which exceeds 3 tons proceeding in any of the roads referred to in column 1 of Schedule 2 to enter the roads in column 2 of Schedule 2.

Exemptions: Conveyance of goods, persons or merchandise to or from premises for the purposes of agriculture, building, industrial operations, reconstruction or repair of roads, gas, water or electricity; garaging, servicing or repair of vehicles; local authority purposes; goods for sale from vehicles, police, fire brigade, ambulance or street cleansing purposes.
