

TYNE AND WEAR COUNTY COUNCIL

Tyne and Wear County Council (Percy Street/Prudhoe Street, Newcastle-upon-Tyne) (Revocation of Box Junction Order 1982).

Notice is hereby given that Tyne and Wear County Council on 4th January 1982 made an Order under section 1 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 6th January 1982, will revoke the present box junction restriction on the east side of Percy Street at its junction with Prudhoe Street.

Full details are contained in the Order, which, together with a plan and a statement of the Council's reason for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the office of The Executive Director of Engineering, Tyne and Wear County Council, Floor 2, Block B, Scottish Life House, Archbold Terrace, Newcastle-upon-Tyne (telephone Newcastle 816144, extension 176) (Mondays to Thursdays, 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. and Fridays, 8.30 a.m. to 4 p.m.).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 4th January 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Wiltshire (Various Roads, Bradford-on-Avon) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Amendment Order (No. 2) 1981.

Notice is hereby given that on 29th December 1981, the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be as follows:

A. To provide for the prohibition of waiting at all times on the following lengths of road in Bradford-on-Avon:

(i) *Belcombe Road*, from a point 9 metres west of its junction with Sandyleaze to Belcome Place (addition).

(ii) *Poulton*, from its junction with Trowbridge Road for 30 metres south-westwards.

(iii) *St. Laurence Road*, from its junction with Trowbridge Road for 30 metres north-eastwards.

(iv) *Trowbridge Road*, south-west side, from a point 40 metres north-west of its junction with Poulton to a point 50 metres south-east of that junction.

(v) *Whitehill*, from its junction with Silver Street for 46 metres northwards.

(vi) *Winsley Old Road*, now forming a cul-de-sac from its east end for 18 metres westwards.

B. To replace the existing limited waiting restrictions on the south side of Mount Pleasant from a point 14 metres west of its junction with Whitehill to a point 52 metres west of that junction, with a Prohibition of Waiting at all times.

C. To provide for limited waiting up to 1 hour with return prohibited within 1 hour between 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on the southern side of Church Street from a point opposite the east end of Holy Trinity Church to the west end of the nave of the Church.

D. To provide for a prohibition of waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or a Sunday on:

(i) the east side of Frome Road to a point 153 metres south of the centre of the Canal Bridge to a point 70 metres south of Moulton Drive; and

(ii) the west side of Frome Road from a point 153 metres south of the centre of the Canal Bridge to a point 25 metres south of Elms Cross Drive.

E. To reserve the south kerb side of Church Street, from a point 6 metres west of its junction with Market Street for 5 metres westwards for use by disabled drivers.

A copy of the Order and plan may be inspected at the County Secretary and Solicitor's Office (Environment Division), County Hall, Trowbridge during normal office hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act, or any regulation made under the said section 84C, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Order will be operative as from 11th January 1982.

LAMBETH LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1971-74

Designation of Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth in pursuance of their powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1971, has designated certain land situated in the Waterloo area the land described in the Schedule hereto, as Conservation Area No. 34 (Waterloo).

The object of such designation is to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of an area of special architectural or historic interest as distinct from individual buildings, to control development in the areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment.

The effect of such designation is that, subject to the provisions of section 277A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and the exemptions contained therein or made by virtue of any statutory provisions therein, no building or part of a building which is situated within the Conservation Area shall be demolished without the written consent first obtained of either the local planning authority (the London Borough of Lambeth) or the Secretary of State for the Environment.
