### WATER RESOURCES ACT

#### NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Severn-Trent Water Authority by Worcester City Council, Guildhall, Worcester to vary licence serial number 18/54/8/200 to abstract water from the River Severn at Worcester, at NGR SO. 8414 5536.

The variation applied for is to provide for spray irrigation of the turf of Worcester Racecourse over variations in the Racing Calendar extending from April to September inclusive involving an increase in abstraction rates from 11,700 gallons per hour to 22,800 gallons per hour, 144,000 gallons per day to 501,600 gallons per day and from 5,760,000 gallons per year to 15,000,000 gallons per year.

#### NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that application is being made to the Wessex Water Authority, Bristol Avon Division, by Port of Bristol Authority to vary the existing licence of right No. 18/54/20/G/50 which authorised the abstraction of water from the underground strata at Henbury, Bristol (grid reference ST 555785). The variation proposed is to increase the authorised annual abstraction from 836 megalitres to 910 megalitres (184 to 200 million gallons) and to increase the authorised daily abstraction from 2.3 megalitres to 2.5 megalitres (0.5 to 0.55 million gallons).

### PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

#### ASHFIELD DISTRICT COUNCIL

#### CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

#### AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT PLANNING AND LAND ACT 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Ashfield District Council in the exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act propose to make an Order entitled "The Ashfield District Council (No. 12) Smoke Control Order 1982" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include Anthracite Coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If the Council make the proposed Order, it will not come into operation before the 1st December 1982, or before such later date as the Council may subsequently determine.

Copies of the proposed Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge during office hours at the offices of the Director of Finance, Watnall Road, Hucknall, and of the Clerk and Chief Executive Officer, Urban Road, Kirkby-in-Ashfield, Nottingham during a period of 6 weeks commencing on 9th April 1982.
