Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea—Solo Motor-Cycle Parking Area and Disabled Persons Parking Place

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 24th March 1982, made the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 25) Order 1982, and the Kensington and Chelsea (Free Parking Place) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 1982, under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order will be further to amend the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that a solo motor-cycle parking area will be designated in Canning Place, the north side, from a point opposite the western wall of No. 8 De Vere Mews eastward for a distance of 4.88 metres.

3. The general effect of the Free Parking Place Disabled Persons Order will be to:

- (a) designate a parking place on the north-west side of West Eaton Place, from a point 1.52 metres north-east of the common boundary of Nos. 3 and 5 West Eaton Place, south-westwards for a distance of 5.18 metres in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;
- (b) provide that the parking place will be in operation between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (c) specify that vehicles displaying in the relevant position a valid permit in a protective cover issued by the Greater London Council to any person whose usual place of abode or whose permanent place of work or business is at premises situated within the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and who fulfils certain requirements as to the degree of his disability or an Institution operating from premises situated within the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and which is concerned with the care of disabled persons may be left in the parking place;
- (d) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking place in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

4. The Free Parking Place Disabled Persons Order will come into operation for the purposes of applications for permits and protective covers and for the marking on the

carriageway of the parking place, etc., on 5th April 1982, and for all other purposes on 13th April 1982. The Waiting and Loading Restriction Order will come into operation on 13th April 1982.

Doctor Parking Place in Weston Park

Notice is hereby given that, on the application of the Council of the London Borough of Haringey, the Greater London Council on 24th March 1982 made the Haringey (Doctor Parking Place) (No. 1) Order 1982 under sections 35, 36, 37 and 40 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) designate a parking place in Weston Park;
- (b) provide that:
 - (i) vehicles displaying a permit issued under the Order may be left in the parking place;
 - (ii) the parking place will be in operation between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day of the week;
 - (iii) a permit may be issued by the Haringey Borough Council on application being made by a legally qualified medical practitioner;
 - (iv) the charge in connection with the issue of permits for the use of the parking place will be £45 and that the permits will be valid for a period of 12 months.

(NOTE. Permits in respect of the parking place will be issued only in connection with the medical practice conducted at No. 11 Weston Park.)

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation for the purposes of the application for permits and for the placing of traffic signs, etc., on 7th April 1982, and for all other purposes on 13th April 1982 of the Haringey (Doctor Parking Place) (No. 1) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously applied that order) and of the map which indicates the length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in Room B.21, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.
