Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

- 2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977, so that in the lengths of street specified in the Schedule to this notice, in addition to the existing restrictions on waiting by vehicles, waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be prohibited between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.
