

Plans showing the boundaries of the area described above are available for inspection at any time during normal working hours at the Braintree District Council Planning Department, Causeway House, Bocking End, Braintree CM7 6HB.

The effect of the designation is that special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving and enhancing the character or appearance of the area designated. In particular controls are applied regarding the demolition of buildings (owners are required to apply to the Council for "Listed Building Consent" before carrying out works resulting in the whole or partial demolition of any building, subject to a few minor exceptions). Control is also imposed in respect of the felling, lopping, topping, up-rooting, wilful damage or destruction to trees within the area (any person wishing to carry out works to trees must give the Local Planning Authority written notice of their intention at least 6 weeks before any action is taken, subject to a few minor exceptions). Penalties may apply in the event of offences committed against these controls.

The Cherwell District Council (Chesterton Footpath No. 7) Diversion Order (No. 2) 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 6th April 1982 the Cherwell District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way known as Chesterton Footpath No. 7 from its present route running from a point G.R. SP.5698/2294 in Shakespeare Drive opposite Lawrence Way in a generally north-westerly direction for 519 metres to a point G.R. SP.5664/2310 to a new route running from a point G.R. SP.5698/2294 in Shakespeare Drive opposite Lawrence Way in a generally south-westerly direction for 81 metres along an amenity footpath and thence in a generally north-westerly direction for 446 metres following the amenity footpath to Wansbeck Drive and thence to Howes Lane at G.R. SP.5663/2314.
