

and continuing generally southerly for 120 metres to a point near the Cart Bridge on the River Dove and also stop up part of footpath No. 22 from a point 130 metres south of the railway on footpath No. 6 and running easterly for 20 metres alongside the drain feeder to the Worsborough Disused Canal Basin.

The alternative way will commence at a point on Footpath No. 6 approximately 70 metres south of the disused railway adjacent to the Worsborough Reservoir Keepers Cottage and proceeding thereafter south-easterly for 100 metres or thereabouts thence south-westerly 30 metres to the Cart Bridge on the River Dove.
