GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Gwent County Council (Maryport Street and Priory Gardens, Usk) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers, have on 19th April 1982 made an Order the effect of which will be:

(1) To prohibit waiting at all times on those lengths of roads as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.

(2) To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on any day on that length of road set out in Schedule 2 to this notice.

Exemptions have been included in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) delivery or collection of postal packets;
- (d) the maintenance of the roads;
- (e) the supply of gas, water, electricity and of any telegraphic line;
- (f) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (g) disabled persons' parking;
- (h) police, fire brigade and ambulance services;
- (i) a funeral.

The Order will come into operation on 7th May 1982.

The Order and a map showing the affected road may be inspected at the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday only).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from 19th April 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE 1

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

Maryport Street

- (a) West side, from its junction with Bridge Street, Usk, route A472, for a distance of 104 metres in a southerly direction.
- (b) West side, from a point 9 metres north of its junction with Church Street for a distance of 27 metres in a southerly direction.
- (c) West side, from its junction with Old Market Street for a distance of 32 metres in a northerly direction.

(d) West side, from its junction with Old Market Street for a distance of 15 metres in a southerly direction.

(e) East side, from its junction with Bridge Street, Usk, route A472 to a point 18 metres south of its junction with Church Street.

(f) East side, from a point 20 metres north of its northernmost junction with Priory Gardens for a distance of 58 metres in a southerly direction.

(g) East side, from a point 20 metres north of its southernmost junction with Priory Gardens for a distance of 40 metres in a southerly direction.

Northern Section of Priory Gardens, both sides, from its junction with Maryport Street for a distance of 15 metres in an easterly direction.

Southern Section of Priory Gardens, both sides, from its junction with Maryport Street for a distance of 10 metres in an easterly direction.

SCHEDULE 2

Prohibition of Waiting 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Maryport Street, east side, from a point 18 metres south of its junction with Church Street, to a point 20 metres north of its northernmost junction with Priory Gardens.

Traffic Regulation Orders in Association with the New Inn By-pass

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, intend to make the following traffic regulation Orders on link roads to the New Inn By-pass:

1. 24 hour main carriageway clearway Order

Waiting will be prohibited on lengths of:

- (i) Pontypool Link Road.
- (ii) New Inn Link Road.
- (iii) Cwmbran Link Road.

2. 30 m.p.h. speed limit Order

Speeds will be restricted to 30 m.p.h. on lengths of:

- (i) Pontypool Link Road.
- (ii) New Inn Link Road.
- (iii) Pontyfelin Road.
- (iv) Edlogan Way Extension.
- (v) Bevans Lane.

3. 40 m.p.h. speed limit Order

Speeds will be restricted to 40 m.p.h. on parts of:

- (i) Cwmbran Link Road.
- (ii) A4051 Avondale Road.

4. Prohibition of Right Turns

Right turns will be prohibited:

- (i) from Butchers Wood Access Road to the Cwmbran Link Road;
- (ii) from the Cwmbran Link Road to Butchers Wood Access Road.

5. Revocation of 3 ton Weight Restriction

The Gwent County Council (Various Road, Croesyceiliog Cwmbran) (Weight Restriction) Order 1980 will be revoked along:

- (i) Part of Chapel Lane Croesyceiliog.
- (ii) Cefn Close Croesyceiliog.

The draft Orders together with plans showing the affected roads and alternative routes, together with a statement of the council's reasons for proposing to make the Orders may be inspected at the offices of the Torfaen Borough Council, Town Hall, Pontypool, and the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).
