## 40 miles per hour Speed Limit at Baughurst

Notice is hereby given that Hampshire County Council proposes making a Road Traffic Regulation Order as follows:

*Effect of Order:* All vehicles will be forbidden to proceed at speeds exceeding 40 miles per hour on that length of Heath End Road (C89) between a point 25 metres north of its junction with Brimpton Road and the Hampshire/Berkshire boundary.

## HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

## The County of Humberside (Holderness Borough) (Various Roads, Bilton) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that on 7th April 1982 the Humberside County Council made this Order which will be operative from 4th May 1982 and will prohibit vehicles waiting at any time in parts of the following roads:

- Ark Royal (East);
- Ark Royal (West);
- Main Road;

## ROCHDALE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

## The Greater Manchester County (Woodbine Street/Elder Street/Woodbine Street East, Rochdale) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Borough) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the Rochdale Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Greater Manchester in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, made an Order the effect of which is:

- (a) To prohibit waiting at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 of this notice;
- (b) To limit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than Sunday in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice to 30 minutes with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The proposed Order would contain exemptions to allow vehicles to wait:

- (a) To enable persons to board or alight;

- (b) To enable goods to be loaded and unloaded;
- (c) To be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation or the removal of any obstruction to traffic and the maintenance of roads or the services therein;
- (d) In connection with any Statutory undertaking;
- (e) To take in petrol, oil, water or air;
- (f) In connection with any wedding or funeral;
- (g) For fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (h) For up to 2 hours return prohibited within 1 hour displaying the appropriate disabled person's badge and a parking disc.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which it relates may be inspected at the Information Offices, New Municipal Buildings, Smith Street, Rochdale, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and 1.30 p.m. and 4.45 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 16th April 1982 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

This Order will come into effect on 19th April 1982.

## SCHEDULE 1

(i) Woodbine Street, northerly side, from a point 135 metres east of its junction with Oldham Road for the remainder of its length, a distance of approximately 35 metres in an easterly direction and including the whole of the turning head with the exception of parking spaces on either side of the turning head.

(ii) Elder Street, both sides, from a point 72 metres north of its junction with Royds Street for the remainder of its length, a distance of approximately 25 metres in a northerly direction and including the whole of the turning head.

(iii) Woodbine Street East, both sides, from a point 10 metres east of Moss Mill Street for the remainder of its length, a distance of approximately 17 metres in a westerly direction and including the whole of the turning head.

## SCHEDULE 2

(i) Woodbine Street, both sides of the northerly spur of the turning head, for the whole length of the parking bays situated three on either side of the spur.

## ROCHDALE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

## The Greater Manchester County (Rochdale Lane and Bradshaw Street, Heywood) (Prohibition of Driving) (Borough) Order 1981.
