

St. Mark's Road. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

(a) On the north-east side between Water Lane and Wellfield Road.

(b) On the south-west side from a point 25 metres from Water Lane to Wellfield Road.

Maddy Street. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of Maddy Street between Wellington Street and St. Mark's Road.

Spa Street. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

(a) On the north-west side between St. Mark's Road and Wellington Street and between points 10 metres and 25 metres south-west of Wellington Street.

(b) On the whole of the south-east side of Spa Street.

St. Mark's Place West. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of the full length of St. Mark's Place West.

St. Mark's Place East. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of the full length of St. Mark's Place East.

Bromley Street. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the whole of the south-east side of Bromley Street.

Ingot Street. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of the full length of Ingot Street.

Brieryfield Road. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of Brieryfield Road between Ingot Street and Vine Street.

Vine Street. Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both sides of the full length of Vine Street.

The restrictions will be subject to the usual exemptions and in all cases there shall be an exemption from the measures for any resident of any of the streets affected who has obtained and displays in his vehicle an appropriate permit, such permits to be obtainable at an initial charge of £3 and to be renewable annually at an appropriate charge.

The reference to Croft Street in the Third Schedule to the Borough of Preston (General Waiting Restrictions) Order 1979 is to be repealed.

A copy of the proposed Order and a copy of the Order to be amended together with plans showing the areas affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected at the Borough Solicitor's Department, Town Hall, Lancaster Road, Preston, during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should do so in writing stating the grounds of your objection and sending it to the Borough Solicitor at the above address so as to arrive not later than Tuesday, 25th May 1982.

YORK CITY COUNCIL

The City of York (Various Streets) (Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd April 1982 the York City Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the North Yorkshire County Council in exercise of the County Council's powers under sections 1, 28, 31 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, made an Order the effect of which will be to introduce the following provisions:

(a) No waiting at any time (with the usual exemptions for loading/unloading, etc.), on the south-east side of Mount Vale from a point 3 metres north-east of its junction with the south-west side of Trentholme Drive for a distance of 80 metres in a south-westerly direction.

(b) Street Parking Places with permits:

(i) in Driffield Terrace (4 parking places) for use by doctors from the adjacent medical practice.

(ii) in The Crescent, (1 parking place) for use by veterinary surgeons from the adjacent veterinary practice.

The provisions in respect of Mount Vale and Driffield Terrace come into effect on 26th April 1982; those in respect of The Crescent on 28th June 1982.

A copy of the Order together with the map showing the lengths of road affected may be seen at my office during normal business hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks from 22nd April 1982 make application to the High Court for this purpose.
