NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Cherwell District Council (Banbury Footpath No. 24 and North Newington Footpath No. 1) Diversion Order (No. 1) 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 21st April 1982 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Cherwell District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the footpath known as Banbury footpath No. 24 from its present route from point G.R. 44083998 between numbers 95 and 97 Bretch Hill in a generally west-south-westerly direction for 780 metres to the North Newington parish boundary at G.R.43423986 including the section diverted by The Cherwell District Council (Banbury Footpath No. 24) Diversion Order (No. 1) 1976 and divert the footpath known as North Newington Footpath No. 1 from its junction with Banbury Footpath No. 24 at the North Newington parish boundary in a west-north-westerly direction for 242 metres past its junction with North Newington Bridleway No. 14 to G.R.43203991 to a new route for Banbury Footpath No. 24 from point G.R. 43964023 by No. 151 Bretch Hill running in a generally south-westerly direction for 650 metres to the North Newington parish boundary at G.R.43403993 and thence as North Newington Footpath No. 1 in a generally south-westerly direction for 210 metres to rejoin the existing route of the path at point G.R.43203991.

A copy of the Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Bodicote House, Bodicote, Banbury, Oxon, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive, Cherwell District Council, Bodicote House, Bodicote, Banbury, Oxon, before 24th May 1982, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or, if any so made are withdrawn, the Cherwell District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
