

## KETTERING BOROUGH COUNCIL

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

*Conservation Areas in parts of Kettering Town Centre, Cranford and Thorpe Malsor*

Notice is hereby given that the Administrative Council of the Borough of Kettering in pursuance of its powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, (as amended) has designated parts of Kettering Town Centre, Cranford and Thorpe Malsor as Conservation Areas.

The effect of the designation is summarised as follows:—

1. Anyone wishing to demolish a building or part of a building within these Conservation Areas must first apply for consent therefore to the Borough Council as Local Planning Authority. Certain buildings are excluded from this requirement.
2. Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop, uproot or damage any tree in these Conservation Areas must give the Borough Council 6 weeks notice of his intention to do so.

The Conservation Areas include parts of Kettering Town Centre and the Parishes of Cranford and Thorpe Malsor and are defined on three plans which may be inspected at the Municipal Offices, Bowring Green Road, Kettering, during normal office hours.

## WYRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

*Conservation Areas at Fleetwood*

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, that the Wyre Borough Council have determined that the areas described in the Schedule to this notice are areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said areas as conservation areas.

The effect of the designation of the conservation areas is that where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation areas is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation areas, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, as amended. Also, subject to certain exceptions, demolition of buildings or any part of a building within the conservation areas will now require the approval of the Council as local planning authority. Anyone proposing to do work on trees in the conservation areas, which are not already protected by a Tree Preservation Order, will be required to give the Council as local planning authority, 6 weeks' notice of their intention. A map showing the conservation areas may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the Town Hall, Fleetwood, the Town Hall, Poulton-le-Fylde or at the office of the Borough Planning Officer, Council Offices, Fleetwood Road South, Thornton Cleveleys.

## SCHEDULE

The conservation areas are as follows:—

1. *The Mount* comprising Abbotts Walk (from Promenade Road to Milton Street); Mount Road; The Esplanade (south side from 8 Hesketh Place to the Mount Hotel inclusive) and the seaward ends of Hesketh Place, London Street, Milton Street, Promenade Road, Seabank Road and Victoria Street.
2. *Albert Square* comprising St. Peter's Place and those parts of Adelaide Street, Albert Street, Church Street, Lord Street, North Albert Street and Victoria Street which adjoin the Square.
3. *Pharos* comprising Arthur Street; Bold Street (from The Esplanade to North Albert Street); Euston Crescent; Kent Street (from Queens Terrace to and including Nos. 27 on the south side and 28 on the north side); Lower Lune Street; Pharos Place; Pharos Street (from The Esplanade to the rear of the properties on the east side of North Albert Street); Queens Terrace; The Esplanade (from Queens Terrace to and including the North Euston Hotel); Upper Lune Street and the northerly ends of Aughton Street (east side only) and Customs House Lane.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980*Public Footpaths (HCC 17 and 21 Chipping Campden)  
Diversion Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 8th April 1982 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Cotswold District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert (i) the length of public path HCC 17, commencing at a point A at the south-west corner of field parcel OS. 399 and running in a north-easterly direction to a point B where it meets public path HCC 21; and (ii) the length of public path HCC 21, commencing at a point C where it meets George Lane and running in an easterly direction to a point D where it meets public path HCC 18; to the following routes:—

- (i) A section of land commencing at the point A described above, running in a north-easterly direction to a point B where it meets public path HCC 18 some 23 yards to the south of public path HCC 21;
- (ii) a section of land commencing at a point F some 15 yards to the south of the point C described above, following the line of the footpath in the old persons' sheltered housing scheme to the point D also described above.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, High Street, Moreton-in-the-Marsh, Gloucestershire and may be inspected free of charge thereat during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Cotswold District Council, Trinity Road, Cirencester, Gloucestershire, before 14th June 1982 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if so made are withdrawn, the Cotswold District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
