

- (f) At all times on both sides of that section of Linwood Road for a distance of 43 metres (140 feet) from its junction with Alma Road.
- (g) Between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. from 1st May to 30th September in any year on the northern side of that section of Percy Road from a point 35 metres (115 feet) east of its junction with Glen Road in an easterly direction to its junction with Beechwood Avenue.
- (h) At all times on the northern side of that section of Poole Road from a point 55 metres (180 feet) west of Queen's Road for a distance of 107 metres (350 feet) in a westerly direction.
- (i) At all times on the northern side of Seabourne Place for its entire length.
- (j) Between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the eastern side of that section of Seafeld Road from a point 23 metres (75 feet) north of Belle Vue Road to a point 23 metres (75 feet) north of Douglas Road.
- (k) At all times on the eastern side of that section of Wimborne Road from its junction with St. Luke's Road for a distance of 14 metres (45 feet) in a southerly direction.
- (l) At all times with an exemption for hackney carriages on the north-western side of that section of Charminster Road from a point 19 metres (63 feet) north-east of its junction with Shelbourne Road for a distance of 22 metres (72 feet) in a south-westerly direction, and the existing 30 minute limited waiting between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. and prohibition of waiting between 7 p.m. and 4 a.m. with exemption for hackney carriages will be revoked.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers,
(b) loading or unloading goods

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- (c) the maintenance of the roads, and
(d) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Brook Street, Aston Clinton) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1981.

Notice is hereby given that on 21st April 1982 the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 1st May 1982, is to prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time along both sides of that length of Brook Street, Aston Clinton which extends from its junction with A41 London Road and continues for a distance of 45 metres in a north-easterly direction.

Exemptions to the Order will permit:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
(2) Waiting for so long as may be necessary: (a) for persons to board or alight; (b) for goods to be loaded or unloaded; (c) for enabling works to be carried out; (d) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
(3) The waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

The proposed Order will provide for the revocation of "The Buckinghamshire County Council (Brook Street, Aston Clinton) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979".

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the lengths of road concerned may be examined at County Hall, Aylesbury, during normal office hours and at Aylesbury Central Library during normal opening hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 21st April 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd April 1982 the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 3rd May 1982 is:

- (1) to prohibit waiting at any time on any day in certain lengths of Priory Street and Tickford Street, Newport Pagnell;
(2) to prohibit waiting for more than 1 hour with return prohibited in 1 hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday in a length of Priory Street, Newport Pagnell.

Exemptions to the Order will permit:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
