

CHESTERFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Chesterfield Borough Council (St. John's Road, Newbold Moor) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Chesterfield Borough Council intend to make the above Order pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Derbyshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the proposed Order, would be to prohibit waiting at any time in the lengths of road referred to in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions would be provided so as to permit vehicles to pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services and when used in pursuance of Statutory powers or duties or in respect of disabled persons' vehicles.

Full details of these proposals are in a draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Chesterfield, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any day from Monday to Friday.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds of your objection in writing to the undersigned by 21st May 1982.

COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Colchester Borough (Catchpool Road, Jarmin Road Etc.) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council, as Agents for the Essex County Council, have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will prohibit waiting between the hours of 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. from Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive on the side or in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice. The Order will come into operation on 3rd May 1982.

The Order will not prevent vehicles waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading goods, allowing passengers to board or alight or to enable works to be carried out in the road. Exceptions in the Order also permit the waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the said section 1 or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 8A, 84B or 84C of the said Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 23rd April 1982, make application to the High Court.

COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Colchester Borough (Old Heath Road, Cavendish Avenue, etc., Colchester) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Croydon Off-Street Parking Places Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Croydon have made an Order under section 31 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 to come into operation on 24th May 1982 which may be cited as the Croydon Off-Street Parking Places Order 1982.

The effects of the Order are:

(a) To revoke and replace (except as provided below) the Croydon Off-Street Parking Places Order 1981.

(b) To increase charges for use of certain car parks by various classes of vehicles as shown in the following schedule. The provisions relating to parking places, classes of vehicles and time limits and charges applying thereto which are not specifically mentioned in the Schedule will be identical to those specified in the Croydon Off-Street Parking Places Order 1981.
