*The Borough of Taff-Ely (Community of Llantwit Fardre Footpath Nos. 48, 49 & 50) Public Path Diversion Order 1982.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 22nd February 1982, was confirmed by the Taff-Ely Borough Council as an unopposed Order on 9th April 1982.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public rights of way running across land situate in the Community of Llantwit Fardre and more particularly described in the Schedule annexed hereto.

##### SCHEDULE

##### Part I. Description of Site of Existing Paths or Ways

The highways to be diverted are in the Community of Llantwit Fardre:

A length of Footpath No. 48 from a point 40 metres or thereabout in a southerly direction from Briar Way 70 metres or thereabout in a southerly direction, a total distance of 70 metres or thereabout and shown on the deposited plan in a bold black line between points A and B.

A length of Footpath No. 49 from a point 40 metres or thereabout in a southerly direction from Briar Way 90 metres or thereabout in an easterly direction, a total distance of 90 metres or thereabout, and shown on the deposited plan in a bold black line between points A and D.

A length of Footpath No. 50 from point D referred to above, 62 metres or thereabout in a south-easterly direction, a total distance of 62 metres and shown on the deposited plan in a bold black line between points D and E.

##### Part II. Description of Site of Alternative Highways

A six feet wide path from a point 40 metres or thereabout in a southerly direction from Briar Way 84 metres or thereabout in a general southerly direction a total distance of 84 metres or thereabout and shown on the deposited plan in a broken black line between points A and B.

A six feet wide path from point B referred to above, 125 metres or thereabout in an easterly direction, a total distance of 125 metres or thereabout and shown on the deposited plan in a broken line from B to E.
