NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

Metropolitan Borough of Wirral—Public Path Diversion Order 1982, Footpath Number 139 Millhouse Lane/ Carr Lane, Moreton.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 19th April 1982 is about to be confirmed by Wirral Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from Millhouse Lane to Carr Lane to a line running from its present junction with Carr Lane for a distance of 100 metres in a southerly direction along Carr Lane then changing to an easterly and southerly direction along Millhouse Lane to the original junction of the footpath. A copy of the Order and a map contained in it has been deposited at the Moreton Public Library and the Town Hall, Wallasey and may be inspected during the hours of opening of those two establishments.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to Wirral Borough Council, Town Hall, Brighton Street, Wallasey L44 8ED, not later than 31st May 1982 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn Wirral Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH ORDER 1982

The South Yorkshire County Council (undefined Public Footpath at Thorne Colliery, Moorends, Thorne) Public Path Diversion Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the South Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of the existing footpath specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto to a line specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge at the offices of (i) Thorne Town Council Offices, Assembly Rooms, Fieldside, Thorne, near Doncaster, and (ii) the County Council, County Hall, Barnsley.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive, County Hall, Barnsley, no later than 31st May 1982 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Yorkshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

SCHEDULE

PART I. Description of site of existing footpath

A part of an undefined public path at Moorends at Thorne, commencing at the eastern end of Grange Road and running thereafter on the south side of the Colliery access road for a distance of 400 yards thence south-east 50 yards and thereafter north-east for 180 yards, thence

30 yards south-east before turning north-east again for 130 yards and thereafter east-south-east 40 yards or thereabouts.

PART II. Description of site of alternative footpath

A footpath having a width of 4 feet starting at point A 60 yards from the junction of Grange Road, Haig Road and Gainford Road at the eastern end and on the northern side of Grange Road and continuing on the north of the Colliery access road for 340 yards then in a northerly direction 120 yards before turning north-east for 260 yards, thence south-east 50 yards and easterly 40 yards before turning south-east for 190 yards or thereabouts to rejoin the original line of the path north of Thorne Colliery at Moorends.

The South Yorkshire County Council (Bridleway No. 9 Parish of Thorpe in Balne) Public Bridleway Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 26th March 1982, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that part of the existing bridleway specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto to a line specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of (i) Stainforth Branch Library, Church Road, Stainforth, near Doncaster, and (ii) County Council, County Hall, Barnsley.

The Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by South Yorkshire County Council that the alternative highway for use as a replacement has been completed but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 245 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 30th April make application for this purpose to the High Court.

Part I. Description of site of existing bridleway

A part of Bridleway No. 9 in the Parish of Thorpe in Balne in the Metropolitan District of Doncaster known as Royalty Lane commencing at a point 150 yards south-west of the bridge over Thorpe Marsh Drain and proceeding in a west-north-westerly direction for 480 yards.

Part II. Description of site of alternative bridleway

Commencing at a point 150 yards south-west of the bridleway bridge over Thorpe Marsh Drain and proceeding generally south-westerly for 140 yards thence generally in a west-north-westerly direction for 430 yards and thence in a north-north-easterly direction for 70 yards.
