- (2) Footpath No. 64 in the Parish of Chaddesley Corbett over the land situate off the C184 Harvington Hall Lane commencing at a point situate approximately 230 metres (252 yards) north-east by eastwards of Harvington Hall, and continuing in an easterly direction for approximately 245 metres (268 yards) thence east by northwards for a distance of approximately 167 metres (183 yards) to terminate at a point situate approximately 626 metres (684 yards) east by northwards of Harvington Hall to a line commencing at the said point situate approximately 230 metres (252 yards) north-east by eastwards of Harvington Hall continuing in an east-south-easterly direction for approximately 190 metres (211 yards) to a point situate approximately 360 metres (394 yards) north of east of Harvington Hall, thence in a north-east by easterly direction for a distance of approximately 224 metres (245 yards) then north-north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 28 metres (31 yards) to a point situate approximately 560 metres (612 yards) east-north-eastwards of Harvington Hall and finally in a south-east by easterly direction for a distance of approximately 108 metres (118 yards) to terminate at the said point situate approximately 626 metres (684 yards) east by northwards of Harvington Hall.

The total length of the existing path is approximately 412 metres (451 yards). The total length of the new path is approximately 550 metres (605 yards).

The Order becomes operative as from 3rd May 1982, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act, as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 30th April 1982 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The South Lakeland District Council (Lowick—Footpaths Nos. 551017, 551019 and 551020) Public Path Diversion Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 30th April 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the South Lakeland District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public rights of way in the Parish of Lowick described in Part I of the Schedule to the route described in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Part 1. Description of Site of Existing Paths

All that length of public footpath No. 551019 commencing at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference SD 2740 8421, to the south of Keldray Farm and running generally in a northerly direction to SD 2739 8436 in the farmyard, then running in a north-easterly direction to SD 2747 8443, a distance of 267 yards. Also all that length of public footpath No. 551017 commencing at SD 2738 8422 to the south of Keldray Farm and running in a north-easterly direction to SD 2739 8425, a distance of 34 yards. Also, all that length of public footpath No. 551020 commencing in the farmyard and running in a north-westerly direction to SD 2737 8438 a distance of 44 yards. The average width of the paths is 3 feet 6 inches.

Part 2. Description of site of new path

All that length of public footpath (totalling 372 yards) which will commence at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference SD 2740 8421 to the south of Keldray Farm and run north-westwards to SD 2738 8422, then north-westwards and northwards to SD 2737 8438, where it follows an existing path to SD 2735 8441 and continues eastwards to SD 2747 8443 where it rejoins the definitive path to the north-east of Keldray Farm. The width of the path will be 3 feet 6 inches.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Nottinghamshire County Council (Southwell Footpath Nos. 35 and 36) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 23rd April 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Nottinghamshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point in the north-western corner of Field O.S. No. 1676 approximately 75 yards west-south-west of the paths' junction with Southwell Footpath No. 37, in a west-south-westerly direction along the northern boundary of Field O.S. No. 0375 to a point in its north-western corner on the east side of Cundy Hill approximately 475 yards north of its junction with Stubbins Lane and also to extinguish the public right of way running from a point on the north side of Stubbins Lane approximately 140 yards east to east-south-east of its junction with Cundy Hill, in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of Field O.S. No. 0354, then in an easterly direction through the hedge into Field O.S. No. 2853 to a point approximately 150 yards east-north-east of the junction of Cundy Hill with Stubbins Lane.
