Pursuant to section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and any enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely

has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the ground that: relief from payment of the duty chargeable in respect of the said goods was afforded under Part 2 of the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Order 1970 and a certain condition imposed by Article 6 thereof namely that the said goods would be exported from the United Kingdom on the departure from the United Kingdom of the person who imported them, namely yourself, but in any event not later than twelve months from the date of their importation, and subject to which such relief was granted has not been complied with.

In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
