ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (A1) (Grantham Bypass) (Prohibition of U-turns) Order 1982

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended on the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Grantham Bypass) (A1), the effect of which is to prohibit U-turns at any point across the central reservation between Gonerby Moor roundabout (junction with B1174) and the southern section of the classified road, known locally as Whalebone Lane, Little Ponton. Exceptions have been provided in the Order for vehicles being used for emergency and maintenance purposes and for agricultural machinery necessarily having to cross the central reservation. The Order will come into operation on 26th July 1982.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any Instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 12th July 1982, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

(a) to provide for the exclusive use of traffic of Classes I and II of the classes of traffic set out in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1980:

(1) a special road about 9.145 kilometres (5.72 miles) in length from Southgate Road A111, Potters Bar to the A10 London-Cambridge-Kings Lynn Trunk Road Roundabout at Bullsmoor; and

(2) two special roads as slip roads, for entry to and exit from the above-mentioned special road at Southgate Road All1 at Potters Bar; and

(3) two special roads as slip roads, for entry to and exit from the above-mentioned special road at Gt. Cambridge Road A10 at Bullsmoor.

(b) to provide for the appropriation of the above mentioned highways as part of the special road which the Secretary of State is authorised, by the scheme at (1), (2) and (3) above, to provide.

The alternative route for non-motorway traffic between Potters Bar and Bullsmoor is via The Ridgeway (A1005), East Lodge Lane, Cattlegate Road, Burntfarm Ride, Whitewebbs Road, Whitewebbs Lane, Bullscross Ride, Bullsmoor Lane and Gt. Cambridge Road (A10).
