THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (Coed Cae Dû, Trawsfyndd Diversion) Order 198

The Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (Coed Cae Qû, Trawsfynydd Diversion Side Roads) Order 198

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

(i) An Order under section 10 of the Highways Act

1980 providing:

- (a) that the new highways which he proposes to construct at Trawsfynydd in the County of Gwynedd shall become trunk roads as from the date when the
- Order comes into operation, and

 (b) that the length of the Cardiff-Glan Conwy
 Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk
 road as from the date on which notice is given by
 him to the County Council of Gwynedd that the new trunk roads are open for through traffic.
- 2) An Order under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:
 - (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways
 - (b) to stop up highways; and
 - (c) to construct new highways

all at Trawsfynydd aforesaid,

and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Gwynedd as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 29th July 1982 to 9th September 1982 at the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff and at the offices of Gwynedd County Council, County Offices, Caernarfon; Meirioneth District Council, Penarlag, Dolgellau and at the Post Office, Trawsfynydd, Blaenau Ffestiniog, Gwynedd.

Any person may not later than 9th September 1982 Any person may not later than 9th September 1982 object to the making of the Orders by notice to the Secretary of State at the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, quoting Ref. WR11/4/42, and stating the grounds of objection.
