Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders, made on 30th July 1982, are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as unopposed Orders, by the Cumbria County Council.

- (1) Divert the footpath which runs in a generally south-easterly direction from near the main entrance of Eskett Quarry for approximately 120 metres to a line running eastwards for approximately 120 metres to a line running eastwards for approximately 90 metres then southwards and south-eastwards for approximately 75 metres (G.R. 0531/1719 to G.R. 0540/1720 to G.R. 0541/1713);
- (2) Extinguish the public right of way which runs from G.R. 0574/1681, on existing footpath No. 412019, and extends generally westwards and south-westwards for approximately 390 metres to G.R. 0539/1672, some 65 metres north-east of the private road alongside the demolished Eskett Farm.
